### **Activity**

- 2. Share the lesson or board through a link with your instructor. Copy the link and post it to your digital portfolio. Depending on the app, the link may be view only or a link with comment or editing rights.
- 3. Write a reflection that includes
  - a description of a lesson where you could use Google Drive or Baiboard
  - if you were able to do this lesson, include your experience, successes and challenges
  - if you were to do this lesson again, how could it be improved?

- 3. Reflect on the positives and negatives aspects of digitizing, annotating and storing paper documents and notes "in the cloud." Share how this process can help you as a teacher? How does your new understanding of the capabilities of these types of productivity apps influence how you might manage your paper document and annotation workflow?

- 4. From the Schoology app, create a Discussion with an attached video from your camera roll. Optional – have students or other teachers enrolled in your course.

- 1. Take a screenshot of your Course page in Schoology which show a minimum of 1 assignment with an image and 1 discussion item with a movie. Upload the screenshot to your digital portfolio.
